♦ What Do We Offer Children throughout the Year?

School Visits: The External Adventures of the Biblio Bee

The Children's Library plays a big role in promoting reading to children from 6–11 years old (junior grades). This program mainly aims at spreading the culture of reading in schools through workshops made by the Library in different schools all around the country. These workshops are divided into three types:

- My Book Digital and Printed: which explains the six steps of binding paper (scanning, selecting, printing, assembling, cutting, and reading)
- Storytelling (Arabic, French and English language)
- Book club: after coordinating with a venue, the visit provides a group of 20 children with a member of the staff to give them a presentation about a celebrity's biography and work or about a famous subject.

Schools' Competition

The Children's Library organizes a school competition that includes both Arabic and language schools. The Library chooses a specific topic that the young students would have to present. The topic can be presented through an artwork, a presentation, or a drama show.

The Children's Library offers a program for babies and preschoolers. This program aims to introduce early learning for children aged 1 day to 3 years, and develop their reading, listening, and learning skills. The program comprises 11 sessions distributed over a month and a half.

New Year

The whole world celebrates the New Year and the Children's Library contributes with them through celebrating the New Year in the second half of December. During the celebration, the Library offers many activities and games.

Orphan's Day

The Children's Library, in cooperation with the Young People's Library, celebrates Orphan's Day in April by inviting children from orphanage institutes. The celebration differs from one year to another through its activities and games.

Universal Children's Day

The Children's Library celebrates Universal Children's Day by inviting several schools to participate in several creative cultural and sports activities.

Science Festivity

Every year, the Children's Library participates in the Science Festivity, organized by the Planetarium Science Center with some activities and programs that fit the theme.

Children Celebration

One of the Children's Library's traditions is to hold a celebration to celebrate the end of summer activities and workshops. In this celebration, the children present different shows, such as: dancing, singing, acting, poetry reading, and comedy shows.



+ How Do We Make Mid-year and Summer Vacations Useful for our Children?

The Children's Library offers two main programs:

Summer and Mid-year Activities Programs

The basic role of the Children's Library is to enhance and improve the child's mental, communication, artistic, and creative skills through workshops and activities that develop these skills in a fun and creative way. Through the past years, the Children's Library upgraded the relationship between the child and the library through different scientific, artistic, sportive, educational, and outreach workshops. Summer and Mid-year Reading Area Programs

The Children's Library organizes two programs: one is held during the mid-year vacation and the other during the summer. These programs are valuable, cultural, and educational tools that fulfill children's needs and suit their specific stages of mental development.
