Depository Library

The Bibliotheca Alexandrina (BA) Depository Library is located within the BA Main Reading Area, F2 level.

The Depository Library (DL) received the United Nations depository status in 1994, which allowed the BA to regularly receive a copy of the publications issued from local, regional, and international organizations to be deposited at the DL.

The deposited publications include publications from the United Nations entities and its specialized agencies, European Union, Arab organizations, and Egyptian entities: UNDP, UNICEF, UNEP, ESCWA, UNODC, FAO, World Bank, UNESCO, ILO, WTO, WHO, ISESCO, ARADO, ALECSO, etc.

The DL also includes the Research Methods Library of Alexandria (RMLA) collection, which was a donation of 5,000 physical research methods resources for the BA. All these publications are sorted at the F2 Floor, according to the name of the organization.

The BA DL aims to provide the public with free open access to information published by international organizations, as well as governmental entities.

Depository Library Databases

Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD)

Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development presents a single e-library offering online access to 20 thematic book collections, 24 periodicals, 3 reference titles, 170 OECD statistical databases, and 10 International Energy Agency (IEA) statistical databases, all in full text.

Source OECD is a main reference and policy engine for European policy–makers. It is also designed to meet the needs of institutions such as universities, government departments, inter-governmental agencies, non-governmental organizations, companies, think-tanks, and research groups. It also includes 10,340 e-book titles, 46,530 chapters, 116,590 tables and graphs, 5,000 articles, 4,690 multilingual summaries, 4,830 working papers and 5 billion data points across 42 databases.

United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UNWOMEN) – Global Database on Violence against Women

In December 2006, the General Assembly of the United Nations adopted a comprehensive resolution calling for intensification of efforts to eliminate all forms of violence against women and requesting the Secretary-General to establish a coordinated database on the extent, nature, and consequences of all forms of violence against women, and on the impact and effectiveness of policies and programs for eliminating such violence. The database was developed and launched in 2009, and was called the "UN Secretary-General's Database on Violence against Women". In 2016, in accordance with the adoption of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, UN Women updated and redesigned the database, and relaunched it as the "Global Database on Violence against Women". UN Women serves as the secretariat for the database.

The database is designed to:

- Provide easy access to comprehensive and up-to-date information on measures undertaken by governments to address all forms of violence against women;
- Increase opportunities for exchange of experiences in addressing violence against women;
- Strengthen the knowledge-base for effective policy responses to prevent and address violence against women; and
- Encourage the further collection, availability, use, and dissemination
 of data on violence against women, as well as analysis of such data.

United Nations Commodity Trade Statistics Database (UN Comtrade)

UN Comtrade provides commodity trade data for all available countries and areas since 1962.

Every year, around 120–140 countries or areas report their merchandise trade statistics to the United Nations. The market share of these reporting countries altogether covers more than 90%—and maybe even as much as 95%—of international trade.

Each of these countries report the trade by commodity and trading partner. The trading partners may cover around 230 different countries or areas. UN Comtrade contains detailed imports and exports statistics reported by statistical authorities of close to 200 countries or areas. It concerns annual trade data from 1962 to the most recent year.

UN Comtrade is considered the most comprehensive trade database available with more than one billion records.
