Who can participate?

Anybody 16 years old and above.

Contest Terms

- 1- The map should include all geographical locations mentioned throughout the novel, without any exclusions or additions.
- 2- Each location should be provided with a caption, a picture, or a three-dimensional object, indicating a major event that happened in that location according to the novel.
- 3- Maps should be based on geographical facts.
- 4- The map's dimensions should not exceed 70 cm x 1 m.
- 5- Maps can be drawn manually or by using computer programs.
- 6- The submitted work should be original and created by the participant; it should not be copied from other works.
- 7- Each participant can submit one work only.

The contest committee has the right to refuse any work that does not follow the above contest terms.

How should I submit my work?

Please submit your work at the Map Library Reference Desk on the fourth basement (B4) of the Bibliotheca Alexandrina. You will be asked to fill in a personal data form.

When should I submit my works?

Anytime during the Library opening hours, from 1 August to 15 November 2010.

What about the prizes?

5 winners will be selected. Each winner will receive a valuable atlas and a certificate. Finalists will be announced in November 2010.
