Last week Mita, Faina, Eugene, Nicholas and I attended the American Association for the Advancement of Sciences meeting in Boston. We are trying something new (most certainly not a mistake) It was great fun, as it also was the first time that we meet Nicholas Padilla, the head of the Latin America Supercourse. Our session included Gil Omenn, M.D., Ph.D., former president of AAAS. *Ismail Serageldin*, the Director of the Library of Alexander made a special trip from Egypt, and presented about the potential of a AAAS/Library of Alexandria Scientific Supercourse, Faina talked about approaches to quality control in the Supercourse. I had the easy job, as I talked about our the Supercourse of prevention, you and all our friends worldwide. We decided the night before that Eugene should talk about the Supercourse in FSU, and Nicholas about the Latin America Supercourse. They did remarkably well with little preparation We had 4 wonderful AAAS officers who commented upon the Supercourse, Drs. Marcus, Kelly, Elfner and Newlon. In addition, Gil Omenn was fantastic as he had us meet 6 of the business meetings, including Engineering, General Interest in Science, Chemistry, Information Science, Psychology and Medicine.

Eugene is from Novosibirsk Siberia, Russia and has been living with us for a few weeks, and Nicolas Padilla from Mexico stayed with us also. It was a most interesting Salsa-Russian flavor in our house. What grand people to stay with us. Eugene and Nicolas, are major “dog feeders”, Benson’s BMI increased dramatically. If you come to visit, you also could stay in the Shubnikov suite.

We obtained Nina Federoff’s AAAS presentation - <http://www.pitt.edu/~super1/lecture/lec31911/001.htm>, which was the keynote address titled Flattening the world the role of science, technology and diplomacy in the 21st century. It was truly an outstanding presentation, to add to her other 2. Dr. Federoff’s Supercourse lectures have had extremely high google page rankings. This lecture is destined to be one of lectures with highest rankings on the web.

We learned much from the officers of AAAS. One concern was that for some people it is not clear that we are not a course, or a curriculum. All we are is a library like the Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh, but instead of books we make available free slides and lectures to teachers. The term “Supercourse” was coined by Tom Songer 10 years ago when we planned to do Distance Learning. We evolved, however, into a global content provider to teachers, not a distance learning course or university, but the name stuck as it has pizzazz. Because of the creativity of our global team of 44,000, we have created a concept extremely simple, build a network, collect PowerPoint slides of science, and share these slides with educators worldwide. We received many valuable comments. Perhaps the most important was from Gail Cassell, M.D.. She suggested that we approach the scientific societies, and Journals. For every scientific society we ask them to contribute \$1,000 to contribute a keynote address from their meetings to the Supercourse. For the journals such as JAMA, Nature of BMJ, we ask them to contribute a lecture from each journal, with a contribution of \$1,000. We would give the

societies considerable web impact, and exposure, and they would keep us afloat. Could you ask your professional societies if they would be interested in joining?
