

Lintel of Seti I in the Greco-Roman Museum in Alexandria

The research is about a lintel of Seti I, preserved in storage of the Greco-Roman Museum in Alexandria, and was not seen by public, whether researchers or interested people before. This upper lintel was probably a part of a religious building, bearing an important scene of liberating King Seti I, who is considered to be one of the most important kings, not only in the New Kingdom but in the ancient Egyptian history.

This research discusses the date of this monument, its description, the historical importance, all inscriptions analysis, and finally an analytical comprehensive study about this lintel.
