

# End of a Contract of Loan In-Kind

## **Abstract**

This paper is an edition of a new Greek documentary papyrus from the collection of Leipzig University after obtaining the necessary permission. It is a part of the researcher's PhD dissertation. The current document is the last portion of a loan contract written in two hands on recto and verso. The hand of the verso is similar to the first hand of the recto. The text contains the risk clause, the praxis clause, and the kyria clause. The contract is written in a single copy, which is common in Oxyrhynchus contracts. In addition, the loan is mentioned by the Egyptian measuring unit of capacity *mouion*, which is mostly related to hay and chaff. This measuring unit is rare in contracts. The verso of the document contains remains of the contract docket. It contains the name of the village, Theogenous, and the value of the debt, which matches the order of the docket for such contracts.
